### **Shooting Star pledges support** for mental health charity

The pair hope that working with Shooting Star over the course of 2020 will enable them to raise the charity's profile and reach more people as a result. The agency will work for the charity on a pro bono basis throughout the year providing them with PR, marketing, online and event support.

"We've got lots planned for the Bearded Fishermen this year," explained Rick. "We're hoping to organise more events, broaden our reach and further expand the services we currently offer.

We are thrilled that the team at Shooting Star will be supporting us with future events, our first being a black-tie fundraiser we're in the early stages of organising.

The charity also runs a weekly 'befriending' support group at Connexions Community Hub in Gainsborough on a Tuesday evening. Visitors are free to drop in, speak in confidence and get help and advice on a range of issues ranging from depression to financial hardship.



Rick said: "Our dream is to own our own support hub, manned by a number of volunteers, that allows us to offer a safe space. It takes a lot of courage for someone to ask for help, so we want to make ourselves as approachable as possible. Having a space of our own that allows us to offer this is our end goal."

Jez Ashberry, Shooting Star Director, commented: "We had 33 compelling entries this year, the highest number of applications we've received to date! We're delighted to be able to offer the Bearded Fishermen the support needed to help them grow, and most importantly, make a difference."

### Trade counter development gets the go-ahead

More job opportunities are promised for Boston later this year, after the town's planners gave the go-ahead for further industrial development.

South Street Capital, on behalf of private investors, received planning consent for a new trade counter development at the Boston Trade Park in Norfolk Street. The site lies about one mile north of the town centre.

Lincoln-based John Roberts Architects secured the planning consent for South Street Capital and the Lincoln offices of chartered surveyors Banks Long & Co and Lambert Smith Hampton will market the

The high-quality trade park scheme will comprise 35,000 sq ft of space, made-up of 11 units, ranging in size from 2,750 sq ft to 4,500 sq ft. It will feature two terraces based at the front of the site, next to Screwfix and accessed from Norfolk Street.

Boston Trade Park is already home



to well-known companies, including Screwfix, Rexel, Crown Paints, Edmundson Electrical, Howdens and Euro Car Parts. A number of units within the new scheme are also already reserved for other trade counter occupiers.

Work on the expansion scheme is due to start on site in April.

Banks Long & Co Associate Director James Hall said: "Now planning permission has been granted, our client can commence construction of the trade park. The new units will be ready for occupation this Autumn."

Lambert Smith Hampton Associate Director Andrew France said: "We anticipate a good level of demand for the units, from both national and regional occupiers."

### Game produces a boost for charity



Monopoly players have championed the work of an equine charity with a donation of £700.

Property professionals who took part in the 38th Lincoln Monopoly Championship - sponsored by RW Stokes and Sons and Banks Long & Copresented the proceeds of their annual game to Bransby Horses.

## Shop front restoration project to be completed next month

Work is well under way for the restoration of a prominent row of shops in Sleaford by Lincolnshire-based Duncan & Toplis.

Duncan & Toplis is enhancing one of the approaches to the £1.2m Heart of Sleaford regeneration project.

Northgate forms one of the main commercial streets through the centre of Sleaford and has been on Heritage England's Heritage "At Risk" List since 2014.

Now, the shop fronts of 10-16 Northgate are being restored to a traditional Victorian design to make the area more attractive and to protect the area's heritage.

The buildings, which are owned by Duncan & Toplis, are currently occupied by a laundrette, a nail bar and a barber. Each of these businesses will have their shop frontages remodelled to appear as they did in the Victorian era.

Similar work has been carried out previously at Duncan & Toplis' office at 18 Northgate.

Duncan & Toplis Director, Simon Syddall

who is also a member of the Sleaford Regeneration Group said: "This area has a lot of character and a rich heritage which has been lost a little in recent years. Our Sleaford Shopfront Scheme will bring this row of shops back to its former glory, making Sleaford a more attractive and more appealing place to explore.

"Duncan & Toplis has invested in Sleaford and supported its businesses and community for decades, but we've never been part of a project which could bring about such significant physical change."

The Sleaford Shop Front Scheme is being funded by Duncan & Toplis with the support of grant funding from Heritage England and with the support of North Kesteven District Council and Sleaford Town Council.

Similar work is taking place across 16 historic buildings in the town in total with the support of the Historic Shop Front Grant Scheme. This includes buildings at Market Place and elsewhere along Northgate.

We need to 'reboot our thinking' and 'influence change' were two of the key messages to be delivered at a local climate change expert panel in Lincoln on January 15.

Hosted by the Chair of Lincolnshire Chamber of Commerce, Gary Headland at the recent Lincolnshire Business Expo, the panel provided the audience with academic, business and local authority perspectives.

The panel discussion, titled 'As business leaders, are we leading the fight against climate change?' was the first event hosted by Lincolnshire Chamber of Commerce and consisted of panel members:

Professor Libby John, a specialist in plant ecology, made reference to Eunice Foote, the first scientist being to discover the warming effect created by an increase in Co2 in 1856, after reinforcing the message; "We are lucky to live here on this amazing planet, there is no planet B - trouble lies ahead....fires, droughts and extreme weather – we need to mitigate and adapt."

Richard Jones, Chamber Assembly ambassador for a low carbon economy, said we want to work with businesses and the City of Lincoln Climate Commission to



raise awareness of this vitally important topic.

Addressing results found from a recent survey, Richard explained "Reducing printing, online meetings, digitising archives and digital only workspace are the top four measures being undertaken by businesses across Lincolnshire, but these are really simple behaviours that we can implement and there is so much more that WE can be doing to influence change for the future."

Steff Wright, Chief Executive of Gusto Homes shared his journey from starting out to the company's first low energy home in 1999 through to where they are today – creating homes for the future.

Highlighting the booming beef industry in Brazil, Steff said: "It's a lifestyle change which may present business threats but also opens up business opportunities and we need to capitalise on those.

"It's about innovating, joining the dots and utilising the different technology - we are taking our commitment to sustainability even further with the creation of our latest development – 'Home of the Future'."

Finishing off the expert panel was Leader of the City of Lincoln Council, Ric Metcalfe, commenting "As a council we have declared a climate emergency and we expect to achieve economic savings by 2030 - we are all responsible, we need to 'change our habits'."

Lincolnshire Chamber of Commerce are asking for support from its members and wider business community to support the Commission to avert a catastrophic climate change.
