We have been able to cook and deliver over 15000 meals and redistribute enough produce to provide an additional 25000 meals. We started the Neighbours Kitchen because it was just the right thing to do but to receive this nomination means the world to everyone involved and will spur us on to do more in the coming months and years. It is an honour to give back to the community who support our unique business in good times."

Continuing the fantastic community spirit with our next nomination is Lincoln Gin, lovingly handmade at The Lincoln Distillery with locally inspired botanicals.

Green light for job creation scheme

More than 400 new county jobs are one step nearer, after councillors gave the go-ahead for work to start on an exciting new development.

West Lindsey District Council has given Stirlin Developments – which is working in partnership with Castle Square Securities and Banks Long & Co – the green light for its Enterprise West Lindsey site.

Stirlin Developments Managing Director James Kirby said: "We are absolutely thrilled to have secured outline planning permission. This scheme has been several years in the making and it will provide opportunities for many years to come. We first identified the site in 2015, as an obvious and required extension of our Saxilby Enterprise Park.

"The Saxilby and Ingleby Parish Council Neighbourhood Plan consultation was in full swing and we had to move swiftly to promote our scheme for its inclusion. The Parish Council was fantastic to work with and appreciated the merits of our proposal."

Although Mr Kirby cannot give a definite start date, initial enabling and site servicing work will get under way within months and definitely before the end of this year.

"The 20-acre site will provide more than 200,000sq ft of space and offer designand-build requirements from 3,000sq ft to 30,000sq ft and a range of freehold and leasehold properties.

"These will include light industrial, hybrid and office units suitable for a wide range of businesses, from start-ups to small-to-medium enterprises and larger national operators wanting a presence in the Lincoln area," said Mr Kirby. "I am feeling incredibly positive about the Enterprise West Lindsey site because its location has fantastic connectivity and has always enjoyed strong demand during the years that we have been developing in the area.

"This site, unlike any other we have previously delivered, will be capable of much larger requirements. Therefore, it will facilitate a much broader range of businesses."

Castle Square Securities Director George Lockwood said: "It's terrific to have secured outline planning permission in this strategic and burgeoning location.



"With a clear understanding of the site and balanced approach to employment use and the environment, we are excited to now see the full potential realised at Enterprise West Lindsey, delivering growth for the district and Greater Lincoln area."

Banks Long & Co Associate Director Lewis Cove said: "We are delighted to hear that planners have given Stirlin permission to make a start on this important project. We look forward to widely marketing the opportunities it offers, to industrial and commercial occupiers across a broad range of sectors."

Council provide grant boost to South Holland market traders

South Holland District Council has created a new funding initiative to provide vital financial assistance to regular market traders in the District, to help our market towns and businesses build for the future and aid the economic and social recovery from COVID-19.

Frequent traders on the District's markets in Spalding, Holbeach, Long Sutton and Crowland have now been contacted by the Council's economic development team to invite them to come forward for a £5,000 grant. This also follows the ongoing decision to temporarily waive market fees for traders since their return in June, to help the transition out of lockdown and towards customers returning to shop with them. Since lockdown began in March the

Council has helped distribute over £17million of Government support to over 1,500 businesses in the District, with this new initiative joining the second phase of discretionary grant funding which opened on Monday (3 August). To qualify traders will need to have not received grants from any other district council, have been trading as a business on 11 March 2020 and not be in administration, insolvent or subject to a striking-off notice.

Foreign investment in Greater LincoInshire creates 300 new jobs

Twenty-six overseas companies invested in the Greater Lincolnshire LEP area in the last year, creating almost 300 new jobs before the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic.

A report from the Department for International Trade shows a 30 per cent increase in successful FDI (foreign direct investment) projects in 2019/20 compared to the previous year.

The number of successful investment projects has now increased every year since 2014/15.

Almost half the 299 new jobs (48 per cent) pay salaries above £25,000 per year as companies invest in automation and require higher skilled technicians and engineers to support the equipment.

The 26 businesses that have invested in Greater Lincolnshire have parent companies in 17 different countries, including Singapore, Iceland, Japan and China. Most investment projects came from Denmark and the United States (four each).

Expansions and acquisitions account for almost one-third of the investment activity – the highest proportion recorded over the six-year period from 2014. Eight businesses were acquired by foreign investors: US-owned Teleflora acquired Interflora in Spalding, Guttridge in Spalding was acquired by the Australian-owned Mitchell Group, and the Japanese-owned Nissui acquired its third Greater Lincolnshire company – Flatfish in Grimsby.

Ørsted, the Danish global leader in offshore wind energy which has a base in Grimsby, has continued to expand, creating 80 new jobs as part of the Race Bank Offshore Wind Farm.

Chinese owned Dynex Semiconductor in Lincoln has invested in the upgrade of its Doddington Road facility, creating 30 additional skilled R&D engineer roles to fulfil automotive sector contracts.

Norwegian food giant Orkla ASA opened a UK central depot for ice cream manufacturer NIC Ice at St Modwen Park in Witham St Hugh's near Lincoln, creating 11 new jobs. German-owned DHL has also moved onto St Modwen Park.

"Last year was another excellent one in terms of attracting foreign investment into Greater Lincolnshire," said Pat Doody, Chair of the Greater Lincolnshire LEP. "We hope to see a further increase



in new inward investments in the food and drink and agritech sectors over the coming years as the Food Enterprise Zone in Holbeach takes shape.

"The FEZ is an ideal opportunity for innovative SMEs in the food supply chain to base themselves alongside the University of Lincoln and a ready-made customer base in the heart of Lincolnshire – the UK's food processing capital."

The Department of Trade Figures relate to the financial year 2019/20 and so do not cover most of the period of the COVID-19 pandemic in the UK.

South Holland Business Awards cancelled

Lincolnshire Chamber of Commerce has announced its South Holland Business Awards will not take place this year.

The difficult decision was taken in a bid to help protect our colleagues, venue staff and as well as minimising risk to the local business community.

Simon Beardsley, Chief Executive, Lincolnshire Chamber of Commerce explains the decision "I am sure you can appreciate this isn't a decision we have taken lightly or with any satisfaction, it is a huge disappointment to us, our year on year sponsors and of course the South Holland business community.

"After careful consultation with the team, the board and partners, we feel the most sensible way forward was to cancel this year's awards."

Councillor Nick Worth, South Holland District Council deputy leader and portfolio holder for growth and commercialisation, said: "It is a great shame, although entirely understandable for everyone involved, that it will not be possible to hold this prestigious event this year. "
