

Council unveils £12m package of support for local economy

Local businesses could benefit from up to £10,000 of funding through a new grant scheme planned by the Lincolnshire County Council.

In light of the economic impact of coronavirus, the council's executive has proposed using some the authority's reserves to provide a £12m package of support for local firms, including business grants. The support is particularly aimed at those that have not benefited from the government's Covid support schemes and smaller businesses with 50 employees or fewer.

Cllr Martin Hill OBE, leader of Lincolnshire County Council, said: "We know local businesses have had a particularly tough time during the pandemic, so we want to make additional support available. Thanks to our careful financial management over the years, we do have reserves we can draw on in times of emergency, and now is the right time to do that.'

Cllr Colin Davie, executive member for economic development, said: "Our small, local businesses are the backbone of the county economy - there are around 43,000 in Lincolnshire, and it's vital we help those that have had no help to ensure they survive the financial impact of the pandemic.

'The focus will be on those businesses that have been unable to access the government's Covid support schemes, such as those that are less than a year old or without premises or home-based.'

There are four grants available Business Recovery Fund, Digital Voucher Fund, Invest for the Future Grand and Rural Business Grant.

Council's support for local businesses through pandemic

South Holland District Council continues to offer vital support to businesses in the District feeling the greatest impact of the coronavirus pandemic, with a further £3.7 million of support issued to over 420 eligible businesses since the end of November, bringing the total distributed to around £22 million since last March.

Funding has been targeted at those hardest hit by the local and national restrictions over this period, including pubs, cafes, shops and restaurants. Every closed business that has submitted applications in good time has now received a full support package until the middle of February, helping them to prepare for



future Government announcements.
To help reduce the burden on

To help reduce the burden on business owners at this difficult time, the Council has also been able to start making these vital payments automatically, without the need to reapply or to provide new details at each new stage or level of restriction. This allows the support to be

processed quicker and gives those feeling the most pressure one less thing to worry about.

In addition to those businesses that have been forced to close, the Council has also agreed a £550k support package for businesses that have been impacted hardest as a result of Covid, despite not

being legally required to close. This package will support business in the supply chain of the events and hospitality sector, the culture and leisure sector, and those with links to the travel and tourism sector, including businesses involved in animal care and welfare. Eligible businesses should begin to receive these payments this week.

The Council continue to closely monitor the latest guidelines and information on any further restrictions that may continue beyond this point that would severely impact South Holland's businesses, and to work to identify what support is most needed and what industries it can be given to.

Military dog handler turns to road safety

A former military dog handler who worked alongside the Army's bomb disposal team, has joined civil engineering firm, Minster Group, as its new health and safety advisor.

Safe storage facilities and the secure disposal of medical equipment were key requirements in the planning of Lincolnshire's second mass COVID vaccination site, based at the county's Showground.

The venue's newly-modernised EXO Centre has expanded into one of the NHS' mass sites being opened across the country.

A drive-through testing facility has been operational within the grounds of the Showground since last spring, originally opening for key workers before being made available to the public. This is separate to the new



centre to ensure protection of those who attend for vaccinations.



Region's LEPs welcome Humber Freeport bid submission

The Greater Lincolnshire and Humber LEPs have welcomed the region's bold bid to form a Humber-wide Freeport, encompassing ports across the area.

Such a development has the potential to boost the economy of the region by providing investment, highly skilled jobs, training opportunities and the development of more clean growth and decarbonisation developments on the Humber – all of which are major priorities of both LEPs.

A formal coalition led by ABP submitted the plans to Government early in February, which were drawn up with support from the four Humber local authorities of East Riding of Yorkshire, Hull, North and North East Lincolnshire, alongside both LEPs and partnering businesses across both banks of the estuary.

The ports of Goole, Grimsby, Hull and Immingham, which this bid incorporates, are already of huge importance to the Humber's economy, as well as the UK's economy as a whole, and Freeport status could further strengthen their position and strategic importance as well as bringing a boost to both the Humber region and the UK's economy as a



whole.

Planned new developments east of Hull, at Goole and at Killingholme – accelerated by Freeport tax incentives – would build on the success of the Humber Enterprise Zone in attracting investment to the area.

Pat Doody, Chair of the Greater Lincolnshire LEP, said: "The Humber estuary is home to one the largest and busiest ports complexes in the UK, and it makes perfect sense to locate a Freeport here based on our global strengths of advanced manufacturing and clean growth.

"This is an enormous opportunity for the Humber which will attract investment and create jobs, particularly in offshore wind, decarbonisation and advanced manufacturing. The benefits however will not just be in the Humber Freeport zone but into Greater Lincolnshire, the Midlands Engine and the Northern Powerhouse through growth in supply chains and jobs.

"We are working closely with the private sector, the local authorities and the Humber LEP and we're confident of success."

Humber Refinery Boss Joins Board of Greater Lincolnshire LEP

The appointment of Darren Cunningham, who is Lead Executive at Phillips 66 in the UK, strengthens representation on the LEP's Board of Directors from northern Lincolnshire.

Last year North and North East Lincolnshire chose to remain in the Greater Lincolnshire LEP area, while the Humber LEP is being renamed the Hull and East Yorkshire LEP.

A chemical engineer by training, Darren has more than 30 years' experience in various refining and commercial roles and has been General Manager of the Humber Refinery since 2017.

He began his career with Conoco at the Humber Refinery in 1985, where he

held various roles in engineering and planning and economics. In 1993 he transferred to the

In 1993 he transferred to the commercial office in London as a crude oil trader. He then took assignments in Singapore and across the United States, working in business development and corporate strategy roles.

He is now leading the Humber Refinery and Phillips 66 UK decarbonisation agenda.

"I'm honoured to join the Greater Lincolnshire Local Enterprise Partnership and look forward to working together as our region looks towards the future in these most challenging times," he said. Phillips 66 is an American multinational energy company based in Houston, Texas.

The Humber Refinery was built at South Killingholme in 1966 and has a crude oil processing supplying 24% of UK fuels. Humber is leading the way in low carbon fuels production and was the first in the UK to produce fuel, at scale, from used cooking oil.

The Humber Refinery is a key partner in two leading decarbonisation projects for the region, Humber Zero and the Gigastack, and is one of the most complex refineries in the Phillips 66 portfolio and one of the most sophisticated in Europe.
